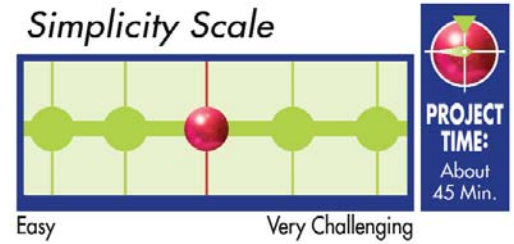

Princess Party Photo Matte and Bingo Game:

Entertain the little princesses with a fantasy filled bingo game and photo matte memento.

Personalize a princess-themed photo matte with the birthday girl's name and date of the party and use your digital camera to shoot a photo of each guest. Print the photos with your PictureMate® Personal Photo Lab, mount to the matte and give to each little princess at the party. Bingo is a great party game and is even more exciting when the the card is a castle and the markers are jewels. Download the templates FREE here at EpsonCreativeZone.com and you'll have plenty of fun-filled activities to entertain the royal party.

Materials Suggested:

(Not all are required) For printing: PremierArt™ Matte Scrapbook Photo Paper for Epson (letter), Epson Matte Paper Heavyweight (letter), Epson Double-Sided Matte Paper (letter), Epson Photo Quality Ink Jet Paper (letter) or Epson Premium Bright White Paper, an Epson PictureMate™ Personal Photo Lab, and an Epson Stylus Photo Printer.

Princess Party Photo Matte:

Step 1: Click on the selected page to open as a .jpg, or import into your preferred layout or photo editing program. The document is 8" x 8" and can be enlarged or reduced to fit any square frame.

Step 2: Personalize your photo matte by typing a photo caption under the box. Use the project photo as a guide.

Step 3: Your personalizing is complete! Print the page. Remember to choose the correct paper size and paper type setting in your printer driver.

Step 4: Trim with a craft knife.

Step 5: Embellish your matte if desired, and place inside a frame.

Princess Party Bingo Game:

Step 1: Click on the provided *Bingo Cards* document to open as a .jpg, or import into your preferred layout or photo editing program. There are 2 cards per letter-sized sheet.

Step 2: Open or import the coordinating clipart (in .png format) and digitally add them to your bingo cards to use as spaces. Create as many cards as you'd like by putting different art pieces in each space. Use the project photo as a guide for your pages.

Step 3: Type the player's name at the top of the card.

Step 4: Your personalizing is complete! Print your page. Remember to choose the correct paper size and paper type setting in your printer driver.

Step 5: Trim your thank you cards directly down the center of the page.

Step 6: Click on the provided *Game Pieces* document to open as a .jpg, or import into your preferred layout or photo editing program. There are 2 sets of game pieces per letter-sized sheet. Trim the game pieces into small squares and place into a large bowl for the “caller” to draw from.

Step 7: Use large store-bought jewels or rhinestones as markers, and have fun!
