

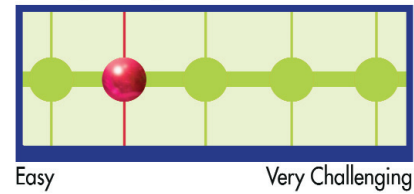

Halloween Party Invite, Photo Matte & Greeting Card:

average per project

Simplicity Scale

Personalize this pop-up party invite with details of your Halloween gathering for ghouls and goblins. A matching photo frame makes a great party favor or place card. Use your PictureMate® to print photos of the costumed guests and apply to frames you print in advance. Send a scary "Boo" personalized greeting card to friends. Download the templates and complete PDF project instructions here FREE at EpsonCreativeZone.com. You'll be ready for a "spooktacular" Halloween celebration.

Materials Suggested:

(Not all are required) For printing: Epson Premium Presentation Paper Matte (letter) or Epson Premium Presentation Paper Double-Sided (letter), Epson Presentation Paper Matte (letter) or Epson Bright White Paper, an Epson PictureMate® Personal Photo Lab and an Epson Stylus Photo Printer.

Halloween-Themed Invitations:

These Halloween-themed party invitation designs can be downloaded in .jpg format and used for your next Halloween party celebration. There are 2 invitation designs and 2 pop-ups per each 8 1/2" x 11" sheet of paper.

Step 1: Click on the Halloween party invite outside file to open as a .jpg, or import into your preferred program.

Step 2: Personalize the cover of your party invitation. Use project photo as a guide.

Step 3: Your personalizing is complete! Print the outside of the invitation. Remember to choose the correct paper size and paper type setting in your printer driver.

Step 4: Download the Halloween invite inside as a .jpg, or import into your preferred program.

Step 5: Personalize the inside of the Halloween invitation with the party information. Turn the page over and print the inside of the invitation on the back of the sheet.

Step 6: Trim along the solid die line with a craft knife, and fold on the dotted lines.

Step 7: Next, click on the Halloween party pop-up file to open as a .jpg, or import into your preferred program.

Step 8: Print the pop-up page of the invitation. Remember to choose the correct paper size and paper type setting in your printer driver.

Step 9: Trim along the solid die line with a craft knife, and fold on the dotted lines for both the pop-up and support strip.

Step 10: Attach the strip to the back of the pop-up with adhesive, attach the pop-up to the inside of the invitation on the top panel (making sure the ghost fold and the invitation fold lines up with each other), finally, attach the other end of the strip to the inside flap of the invitation.

Step 7: Embellish your invitations if desired, and place in standard A2 note card sized envelope. Use product photo as a guide.

Halloween-themed Photo Matte for 4"x3" Photo:

Step 1: Take pictures at your Halloween party and print 4"x3" photos from your PictureMate™ Personal Photo Lab.

Step 2: Click on the selected matte to open as a .jpg, or import into your preferred layout or photo editing program. The matte is created to fit 2-up on an 8 1/2"x11".

Step 3: Personalize your photo matte by typing your name above the photo and personal message across the bottom. Use the project photo as a guide.

Step 4: Your personalizing is complete! Print the page. Remember to choose the correct paper size and paper type setting in your printer driver.

Step 5: Trim the matte along the dotted line around the ghost and fold on the solid line.

Step 6: Using your PictureMate™ Personal Photo Lab, print your 4"x3" photos at the party. Adhere your photos to your pre-printed photo mattes, embellish and use as a favor for your guests!

Halloween-Themed Greeting Card:

Step 1: Click on the selected file to open as a .jpg, or import into your preferred program. The cards are created to fit 2-up on an 8 1/2"x11".

Step 2: Personalize the inside of your card with a Halloween message. Use the project photo as a guide.

Step 3: Your personalizing is complete! Print the front of the card. Remember to choose the correct paper size and paper type setting in your printer driver. Turn the page over and print the inside.

Step 4: Trim the cards along the solid line with a craft knife, and fold in half along the dotted line.

Step 5: Embellish your cards if desired, and place in coordinating A2 envelopes.
